

Where does the water come from?

Clough Foot

The north-eastern part of the Rochdale Canal, from its summit to Sowerby Bridge where it joins the Calder & Hebble Navigation, is supplied by many different water sources

Chelburn Reservoir Is owned by United Utilities (UU). The Trust has an agreement with UU who provide water to help support levels

Feeders (diverted streams) and Chelburn Reservoir are the main feeds to the summit

Tuel Lane Lock, built during the canal restoration in 1996 to replace original locks 3 & 4, is the deepest lock in the UK with a fall of 6 metres
