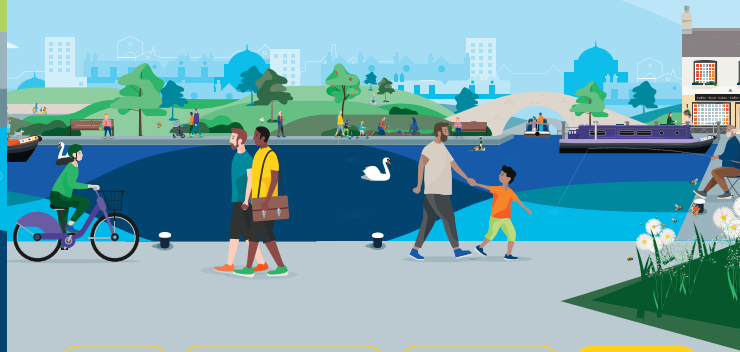
Making life better by water

The Kennet & Avon Canal runs from the River Thames to the River Avon, connecting Reading, Bath and Bristol. Caen Hill Locks, designed by canal engineer John Rennie were the last part of the 87 mile (140km) canal to be completed in 1810.

The canal features a number of remarkable structures including Crofton and Claverton Pumping Stations, and Dundas and Avoncliff Aqueducts.

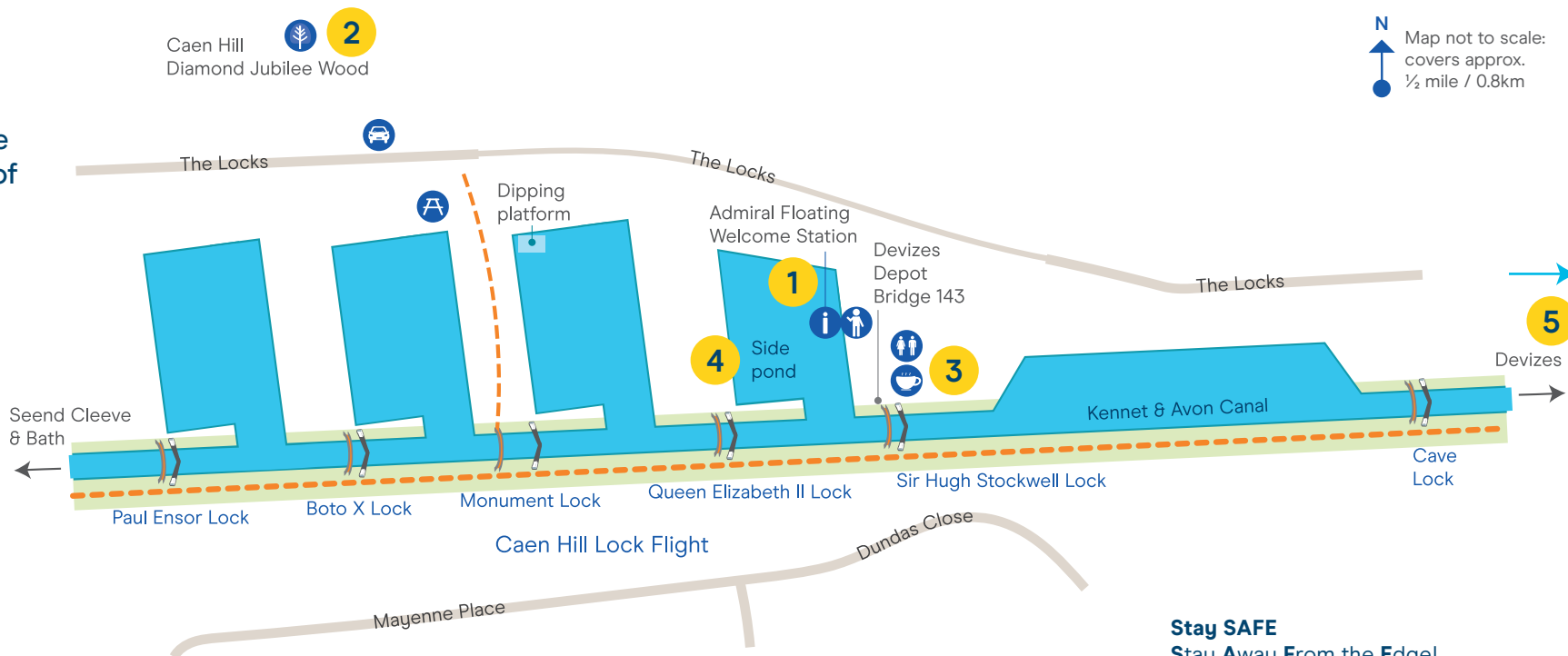
The 16 locks that form the steepest part of the flight at Caen Hill is a scheduled ancient monument and the longest continuous flight of locks in the country.

5 things to do at Caen Hill Locks

- 1 Visit** our floating welcome hub, the Admiral, and find out more about Caen Hill, one of the seven wonders of the waterways.
- 2 Pick** up a guide from our welcome hub and explore Jubilee Woodland, one of 60 new woods that were planted in 2012 to commemorate Queen Elizabeth II's Diamond Jubilee.
- 3 Grab** a cup of coffee from the cafe and watch the boats navigate the locks.
- 4 Enjoy** spotting wildlife in the side ponds that adjoin each lock and prevent the canal from running out of water.
- 5 Follow** the canal up to the pretty town of Devizes and the Kennet & Avon Canal Museum (1 mile/1.5km).

Did you know?

The full Caen Hill lock flight has 29 locks across 2 miles (3.2km). These locks have a total rise of 237ft (72m) or a 1 in 44 gradient.
